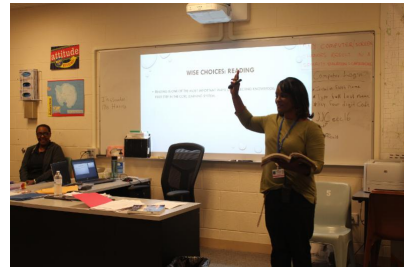

Assessment isn't just an event that takes place at the end of instruction. Rather, assessment experiences can be integrated into any lesson or activity and drive real-time instructional adjustments for teachers and real-time learning adjustments for students that increase achievement. Both teachers and students become data-driven users of ongoing assessment. Participants will learn the critical components of the formative assessment process and techniques that scaffold learning experiences that develop self-regulated, assessment-capable students that are in control of their learning, receive tools to guide conversations with teachers that encourage evidence-based instructional decisions that result in intentional teaching and learning, and learn how key formative assessment concepts enhance teacher practice that aligns with the Danielson Framework for Teaching.
